#### Robert V. Racunas, Esq.

For over 40 years, Robert V. Racunas served as Executive Director for Neighborhood Legal Services, responsible for the overall management of NLS and expanding on its mission of access to justice.

Bob attended the University of Pittsburgh on athletic and Senatorial scholarships. He received his Juris Doctorate from the University's School of Law as an Owens Fellow.

After graduation, Bob joined NLS as a staff attorney and was named the Managing Attorney for the McKeesport and Clairton offices. In 1976, he became the program Deputy Director responsible for Beaver, Butler, and Lawrence counties. The NLS Board of Directors appointed him Executive Director in July 1980.

Bob has been involved in many community and legal activities. He was Chair of his local Zoning and Appeals Board for thirteen years. He has served as Chair of the Allegheny County Bar Association Federal Court Section, as a hearing officer for the Disciplinary Board, as a member of its Board of Governors, as well as President of the more than 6.000 member bar association.

Bob has also been a member of the House of Delegates of both the Pennsylvania Bar Association and the American Bar Association. His awards include the University of Pittsburgh Letterman of Distinction, the Community Service Award from the Josh Gibson Foundation, a Pennsylvania Legal Aid Network Excellence Award, the 2006 University of Pittsburgh School of Law Alumni of the Year Award, and a recipient of a University of Pittsburgh Chancellor's Medallion.

#### Mark Schwartz, Esq.

Mark Schwartz served as Regional Housing Legal Services Executive Director for nearly 40 years, advocating for affordable housing for Pennsylvanians. He continues to provide support to the organization as Of Counsel.

Mark joined Regional Housing Legal Services as a staff attorney in 1974, only a year after the organization was formed, helping to expand its reach while building out policy and advocacy for affordable housing and access to utilities. He introduced the Pennsylvania Utility Law Project to Regional Housing Legal Services, and was instrumental in the creation of the Housing Alliance of Pennsylvania as well as the Pennsylvania Health Law Project. Mark was heavily involved with the creation and implementation of the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit in Pennsylvania, currently the central source of financing for new affordable housing.

Mark was one of the founders and longtime President of the Junior Jewish Basketball League in the Philadelphia area, as well as one of the founders of the Delaware Valley Synagogue League (softball), and the Eric Zucker Memorial Scholarship Fund. Mark was a Vice-President of East Abington Little League and is an active member of Congregation Adath Jeshurun in Elkins Park.

Mark graduated from Temple University and Villanova University Law School. He and his wife, Bernice, a preschool professional, reside in Abington Township. They have two sons, Jon and Andy, and three granddaughters Lily, Josie, and Jackson.

#### Randy & Debbie Blough

Randy and Debbie Blough are retired scientists who volunteer at the Honey Brook Food Pantry in Chester County, where they collect clothes for pantry clients and help families apply for food stamps and navigate issues like utility shutoffs. In 2018, they uncovered a hidden inequity affecting mobile homeowners in Pennsylvania. The Bloughs realized the only way to remedy the problem was through a tax reassessment, so they cobbled together donations to cover filing fees, learned how to go through the reassessment appeal process, and filed appeals for 22 food pantry clients. In all 22 cases, mobile home reassessments were granted, saving clients \$20,000 in taxes that year. In 2019, news of Debbie and Randy's groundbreaking work resulted in a partnership between Legal Aid of Southeastern Pennsylvania and the United Way of Chester County, known as the Chester County Mobile Home Property Tax Reassessment Project. Debbie and Randy played a crucial role in organizing this first-of-its-kind program, providing training and materials to a team of 30 volunteers. Due to the project's immense impact and success, a second mobile home tax reassessment project was recently launched in Bucks County.

#### Liz Maria Chacko, Esq.

Liz Maria Chacko is the Deputy Director of Justice at Work, providing oversight for all legal services. Liz has been with Justice at Work since 2006 and has remained steadfast in her commitment to improving the availability and quality of civil legal services for low-income people in

Pennsylvania. Liz has served on the Pennsylvania Joint State
Government Commission's Advisory Committee on Human Trafficking,
and has been an advisor to Oxfam America and the Southern Poverty
Law Center. She is a former member of the board of the Pennsylvania
Immigration and Citizenship Coalition and is currently an adjunct
professor at University of Pennsylvania Carey School of Law. She
received her law degree from Boston College Law School, where she
served on the editorial board of the Boston College Journal of Law and
Social Justice. Liz was the first member of her family born in the United
States and became interested in immigrants' rights and workers' rights
because of her own history and her family's migration experience.

### Consumer Subcommittee of the Medical Assistance Advisory Committee

The Consumer Subcommittee of Pennsylvania's Medical Assistance Advisory Committee addresses inequities and improves healthcare access within Pennsylvania's Medicaid program. It is comprised of fifteen members from across the state who advocate on behalf of the more than 3.3 million Pennsylvanians who depend on Medicaid to live healthy, fulfilling lives. Each member of the Subcommittee has firsthand experience with the Medicaid system because they are past or present beneficiaries, have family members who are recipients, or work for welfare rights organizations. One of the nation's most active consumer advisory groups, the Subcommittee meets monthly with Pennsylvania's Department of Human Services to discuss policies and programs that could affect low-income recipients. In addition to offering consumers a seat at the table with state policymakers, the group plays a leading role in promoting an accessible, equitable, and high-quality Medicaid program in Pennsylvania. Louise Brookins founded the Subcommittee in the 1980s, and her daughter, Sonia Brookins, continues its work as the current Chair.

#### John Gandrud, Esq.

John Gandrud has dedicated himself to serving legal aid and Northwestern Legal Services' client community for 36 years. John first joined Northwestern Legal Services as a Staff Attorney, gaining valuable experience in a wide range of cases. In 1997, John was recognized by the Client's Council of Erie County "for his unceasing efforts to ensure quality legal services to all people of the client community." John helped to create the Central Intake Unit in 1996, eventually becoming its Managing Attorney a year later. John was instrumental in developing an online intake system in 2011. He also serves as administrator for their case management system. In addition to these duties, John provides telephone legal assistance to residents in Northwestern Legal Services' entire 10-county service area. From 1996 to present, he has helped approximately 25,000 clients in the areas of housing, family, consumer, education and expungement law. John is a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh School of Law and served in the National Guard for 20 years.

#### Doreen Mitchell

Doreen Mitchell is the Special Projects Coordinator for Housing for Neighborhood Legal Services. She is the point of contact expediting referral processes among project partners from housing eviction and foreclosure prevention program operators. She started her career with Neighborhood Legal Services as a receptionist, later becoming an Intake Specialist, Protection from Abuse Intake Coordinator, and Expungement Coordinator. Doreen champions legal aid efforts by taking additional steps to identify ways to serve more clients, such as volunteering to conduct outreach presentations and promoting legal aid in the community. She also facilitates in-person and online expungement outreach in Allegheny, Beaver, Butler, and Lawrence counties. Doreen serves as the Co-President of the Iron City Legal Assistance Workers Union and is an active member of her program's labor management committee. She is also the unofficial social director at Neighborhood Legal Services, organizing birthday parties, holiday gatherings, going away parties, and other events.

#### Morgan Lewis

From their founding in Philadelphia in 1873, to a team of 2,200 lawyers and specialists providing services around the globe, Morgan Lewis is committed to serving the public good, starting in its community. Besides specializing in corporate, transactional, litigation, and regulatory services to clients in major industries worldwide, Morgan Lewis provides free legal services to nonprofit and nongovernmental organizations whose mission is to serve vulnerable individuals and communities. Each year, Morgan Lewis attorneys donate more than 120,000 hours to pro bono work, providing more than 1,800 clients with pro bono support in a wide range of cases in five key areas: Social Security disability, veterans' benefits, access to education, healthcare, and housing. Since 2018, 100% of its lawyers have met the firm's Pro Bono Challenge of donating at least 20 hours to pro bono service annually. In Pennsylvania, the Philadelphia team has been a particularly important pro bono partner to Community Legal Services. In March 2021, a team of attorneys from Morgan Lewis and Community Legal Services helped to negotiate an extraordinary resolution in a landmark case versus the USDA, securing more than \$700 million in emergency assistance for over 650,000 families.

Pittsburgh Eviction Prevention Collaborative *In June 2020, Community Justice Project, the Hill District Consensus* Group, and the Pittsburgh Hispanic Development Corporation joined forces to address the impending eviction crisis. The project has since grown into an independent organization known as RentHelp Pittsburgh, whose mission is to stabilize Allegheny County's most vulnerable households. Advocates working on behalf of these groups employ an integrated eviction response system that combines outreach and rapid response efforts, resource navigation and mediation, and legal defense services. Their work is supported by ongoing partnerships with Carnegie Mellon University's CREATE Lab, Pittsburgh Union of Regional Renters, and other service providers—together forming the Pittsburgh Eviction Prevention Collaborative. In addition to providing tenants with rent relief services, these affiliated community organizations help tenants access broader support like childcare, food assistance, healthcare, and job training. As a result of their collective efforts, hundreds of families have been able to remain in their homes.

#### Julia Simon-Mishel, Esq.

Julia Simon-Mishel is the Supervising Attorney of the Unemployment Compensation Unit at Philadelphia Legal Assistance, where she represents low-wage workers in unemployment matters. Julia has represented over 700 clients and has an active appellate practice pursuing impact unemployment cases in Pennsylvania courts. She serves by appointment on Pennsylvania's Unemployment Compensation Benefit Modernization Advisory Committee and has testified by invitation before the Pennsylvania legislature many times on issues affecting her clients. During the pandemic, Julia spearheaded community outreach and education about unemployment programs in Pennsylvania, working closely with social service organizations, community groups, legal services organizations, and local officials to help tens of thousands of workers access benefits. Prior to joining Philadelphia Legal Assistance, she clerked for the Honorable Norma L. Shapiro of the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Julia was recently named one of the American Bar Association's "One the Rise: Top 40 Young Lawyers" and a Super Lawyers "Rising Star" in Pennsylvania. She graduated magna cum laude from the University of Pennsylvania Law School and Brandeis University.

#### The Honorable Mary Gay Scanlon

Congresswoman Mary Gay Scanlon has dedicated her career to serving the most vulnerable – first as a lawyer and now in Congress. She was first sworn into the U.S. House of Representatives on November 13, 2018, following a special election, and currently represents Pennsylvania's 5th Congressional District.

Congresswoman Scanlon's legislative priorities include voting rights, access to justice, education, supporting economic growth for her region, common-sense gun safety, and ending hunger. All these priorities align with Congresswoman Scanlon's main goal as an elected official: protecting and improving the lives of America's children, families, veterans, and seniors. She currently serves on the House Judiciary Committee, House Committee on Rules, and Committee on House Administration, and chairs the House Caucuses on Access to Legal Aid and Youth Mentoring.

As a staunch believer that everyone is entitled to equal protection under the law, Congresswoman Scanlon previously worked as national pro bono counsel at a major U.S. law firm, where she directed and supervised over 600 lawyers across 15 offices in providing more than 50,000 hours of pro bono legal services annually to low-income clients and nonprofit organizations. Under her leadership, the pro bono program worked on critical issues, including voting rights, child advocacy, immigration, public benefits, and criminal justice reform.

Before her election to the U.S. House of Representatives, Congresswoman Scanlon also served as an attorney at the Education Law Center, president of her local school board, and cochair of the Voting Rights Task Force of the Association of Pro Bono Counsel. She is a graduate of Colgate University and the University of Pennsylvania Law School. The Congresswoman and her husband, Mark, reside in Swarthmore and have three adult children.

## PLAN Excellence Award for Lay Advocacy



In 2018, retired scientists **Debbie** and Randy Blough discovered that mobile homes are overtaxed during their volunteer work at Honey Brook Food Pantry in Chester County. They researched the problem and successfully appealed 22 tax assessments on their own.

Since then, Debbie and Randy have worked with Legal Aid of Southeastern PA and United Way of Chester County to develop the **Chester County Mobile Home Tax Reassessment Project**. From 2019-21, the partnership has helped 756 residents save an average of \$883 per year per home, or almost \$10.6 million over 10 years.

This project would not exist without the Bloughs' inspired lay advocacy to help Chester County residents.






